Membership Register

The Membership Register, maintained on computer, is essential to the efficient administration of F.O.M.A. It contains only members' names, addresses, telephone numbers, and email addresses together with essential membership information (e.g. payment of subscriptions).

The Membership Register will not be released to any outside body. However, subject to your confirmation, your details (name, address, telephone number, email address) may be disclosed as follows. The Rules require all members not to disclose your details further. No details of any child under 18 years of age will be disclosed.

Gift Aid - Your Questions Answered

What is Gift Aid ?

A method of allowing charities (including FOMA) to increase their income by reclaiming any tax that you have already paid on your subscription or donation. It is currently worth £2.82 for every £10 paid.

What is a Gift Aid Declaration ?

A simple statement (overleaf) which you sign to allow FOMA to claim back any tax you have already paid on your subscription or donation, backdated for up to six years.

Who qualifies to complete a Gift Aid Declaration ?

Anyone who is a UK taxpayer (i.e. pays any income tax or capital gains tax). You do not need to pay a tax bill or fill in a Tax Return to be a taxpayer; tax deducted at source from pay, pension, building society or bank interest (if you have not claimed income tax exemption), dividends etc. all counts.

Will I have to make entries on a Tax Return ?

Only if you fill in a Tax Return already. There is no extra tax to pay, and if you pay tax at higher rates you can reclaim a further tax rebate for yourself.

Can I complete Gift Aid declarations to several different charities ?

Yes, provided the tax you pay covers the tax reclaimed on all of your subscriptions or donations. At the current tax rate of 20% the tax reclaimed is 25%, so if your Gift Aided donations or subscriptions total $\pounds 100$ in any tax year (April 6th to April 5th), you would have to pay at least $\pounds 25$ tax in that year.

You must tell F.O.M.A. if, in any tax year, the tax you pay does not cover the tax reclaimed (e.g. if you pay no tax at all).
